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INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT ON APPLYING AGREED-UPON PROCEDURES

We have performed the procedures enumerated below, to which the Fairfield County Republican Executive Committee (the Committee) agreed, solely to assist the Committee in evaluating its compliance with certain requirements included in Ohio Rev. Code Sections 3517.1012, 3517.13(X)(1), (2)(b), (3)(a), and (4), 3517.17, and 3517.18, for the year ended December 31, 2008. The Committee is responsible for complying with these requirements. We followed the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants' attestation standards for agreed-upon procedures engagements. The sufficiency of the procedures is solely the responsibility of the Committee. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

Cash Receipts

1. We inquired of the Committee whether they deposited all gifts from corporations, labor organizations and all gifts restricted to operations into the same fund into which they deposit amounts received from the State Tax Commissioner. Management informed us they received no such gifts.
2. The Committee did not file the required Deposit Form 31-CC, rather they filed the *Statement of Contributions Received* (Form 31-A). We footed the *Statement of Contributions Received* (form 31-A) filed for 2008. We noted no computational errors.

Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.17 requires a political party to deposit into its restricted fund all public monies received from the Ohio Political Party Fund. Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.1012(B) states, in part, that a county political party shall file deposit and disbursement statements, in the same manner as the party is required to file statements of contributions and expenditures under section 3517.10 of the Revised Code, regarding all deposits made into, and all disbursements made from, the party's restricted fund. Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.10 (C)(6)(b) states the Secretary of State shall prescribe the form for all statements required to be filed under this section. As prescribed by the Ohio Secretary of State, the Committee is required to use the *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Deposits* (Deposit Form 31-CC revised 3/05) to report all receipts from the Ohio Political Party Fund. This form should be used to file future annual reports.

3. We compared bank deposits reflected in 2008 restricted fund bank statements to total deposits recorded in Form 31-A filed for 2008. The bank deposit amounts agreed to the deposits recorded in the Form.

Cash Receipts (Continued)

4. We confirmed amounts received from the State Tax Commissioner pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code 3517.17(A), and agreed all payments to amounts shown on Deposit Forms 31-A filed for 2008. The Committee did not receive 2008 third and fourth quarter payments from the State Tax Commissioner.

The Office of Budget and Management informed us they cannot make payments to entities unless they file an IRS form W-9 to them. We recommend that the Committee determine if they filed their W-9 with the Office of Budget and Management (OBM) so they can receive the 2008 quarterly payments they are owed.

5. We scanned other recorded 2008 receipts for evidence that a corporation or labor organization may have exceeded the \$10,000 annual gift limit Ohio Rev. Code 3517.13(X)(3)(a) imposes. We found no evidence that any corporation or labor organization exceeded this limit.

Cash Reconciliation

1. We recomputed the mathematical accuracy of the December 31, 2008 reconciliation for the bank account used for receipts and disbursements restricted pursuant to Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.1012(A). We found no computational errors.
2. We agreed the bank balance on the reconciliation to the bank statement balance as of December 31, 2008. The balances agreed.

Cash Disbursements

1. The Committee did not file the required Form 31-M, rather they filed the *Statement of Expenditures* (Form 31-B). We footed the *Statement of Expenditures* (Form 31-B) filed for 2008. We noted no computational errors.

Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.1012(B) states, in part, that a county political party shall file deposit and disbursement statements, in the same manner as the party is required to file statements of contributions and expenditures under section 3517.10 of the Revised Code, regarding all deposits made into, and all disbursements made from, the party's restricted fund. Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.10-(C)(6)(b) states the Secretary of State shall prescribe the form for all statements required to be filed under this section. As prescribed by the Ohio Secretary of State, the Committee is required to use the *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Disbursements* (Disbursement Form 31-M) to report all disbursements from the Ohio Political Party Fund. This form should be used to file future annual reports.

2. Per Ohio Rev. Code 3517.13(X)(1), we scanned Disbursement Form 31-B filed for 2008 and inquired of management whether they transferred any cash from the restricted fund to any other political party account into which contributions may be made or from which contributions or expenditures may be made. We found no evidence of prohibited transfers.
3. We compared the amounts on checks or other disbursements reflected in 2008 restricted fund bank statements to the disbursement amount reported on Disbursement Form 31-B filed for 2008. We found no discrepancies.
4. For the disbursement on Disbursement Form 31-B filed for 2008, we traced the payee and amount to payee invoice and to the payee's name on the canceled check. The payee and amount recorded on Disbursement Form 31-B agreed to the payee and amount on the canceled check and invoice.

Cash Disbursements (Continued)

5. We scanned the payee for the 2008 disbursement for evidence that it might represent a contribution or campaign-related disbursement, both of which Ohio Rev. Code 3517.13(X)(2)(b) prohibit. We found no evidence that the restricted fund disbursement represented a contribution or campaign-related disbursement.
6. We compared the signature on 2008 check to the list dated July 31, 2008 of authorized signatories the Committee provided to us. The signatory on the check we selected was an approved signatory. We compared the endorsement to the payee listed on the check without exception.
7. We scanned the 2008 restricted fund disbursement recorded on Disbursement Form 31-B for evidence that it represented a transfer from the restricted fund to any other state or county political party, which Ohio Rev. Code 3517.13(X)(4) prohibits. We found no evidence of any transfer.
8. We compared the purpose of the disbursement listed on 2008 Disbursement Form 31-B to the purpose listed on the vendor invoice and to the purposes Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.18 permits. We found no instance where the purpose described on the invoice violated the restrictions of Ohio Rev. Code Section 3517.18.

We were not engaged to, and did not examine each *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Deposits* and *Statement of Political Party Restricted Fund Disbursements* filed for 2008, the objective of which would have been to opine on compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that we would have reported to you.
